Night at the Manial Palace Museum Nothing Vanishes, Everything Transforms

Art D'Égypte is pleased to present *Nothing Vanishes, Everything Transforms*, the second in a successful series of pop-up shows to be held at different heritage sites across Egypt. Curated by Nadine Abdel Ghaffar, *Nothing Vanishes, Everything Transforms* will be on view from October 28 - November 28, 2018, and will be inaugurated with *A Night at the Manial Palace Museum*. This collection of artworks, installations and performance pieces by thirty two of Egypt's foremost contemporary artists will be presented at the Manial Palace Museum in Cairo designed by Prince Mohammed Ali Tewfik, creating a unique dialogue between contemporary Egyptian artists and Prince Mohammed Ali's creative journey. The inaugural event will be held under the auspices of the Egyptian Ministry of Antiquities. H.E. Dr. Khaled El-Enany, Minister of Antiquities will present heritage preservation initiatives undertaken to promote and conserve Egypt's rich cultural heritage.

This is the second year that this bold curatorial event has taken place. In October 2017 Art D'Égypte held its very successful inaugural event *Eternal Light* at the Egyptian Museum in the heart of Tahrir Square. Art D'Égypte, a privately owned, multidisciplinary art consultancy, continues their innovative approach to creating a dialogue between contemporary art and Egyptian heritage. This year guests will have the unique opportunity to observe contemporary Egyptian art in a profound discourse with the magnificent Manial Palace on Rhoda Island, housing a number of exquisite buildings and a unique botanical garden. This open air museum holds a unique collection of Persian, Ottoman, neo-Mamluk and Rococo artefacts and architectural gems.

For one enchanting evening, attendees of *Nothing Vanishes, Everything Transforms* will be able to witness a unique blending and creative response by Egyptian contemporary art practitioners to the exquisite setting of the Manial Palace. Guests will experience how the backdrop of the Manial Palace imbues the contemporary works with deeper resonance and enhances their ability to build the next layer of the Egyptian story. Witnessing the presence

of contemporary artwork in this setting will stimulate the audience to question long-held interpretations of Egyptian culture.

In many people's minds, Egypt invokes visions of pharaohs, temples and pyramids or of the turbulent politics of the past six years. Little is known on an international level about the wealth of culture that was collected, inspired and commissioned in Egypt during the early 20th century. Little is also understood about of modern and contemporary art that seeks to transcribe the social, political and cultural issues of the present—or simply to portray contemporary life-by drawing on the visual motifs of Egypt that underpin the Egyptian identity to this day. *Nothing Vanishes, Everything Transforms* brings together works by Egypt's most prominent contemporary artists to show the world that Egypt continues to play a crucial role in contemporary artistic and cultural life. The artworks on display draw upon various elements of the styles, movements, colours and themes of art and transform them into multi-faceted conversations that reflect and reinterpret the complexity of Egyptian culture for the 21st century's global audience.

In addition to creating new markets for Egyptian art, highlighting the complexity and richness of the Egyptian cultural landscape, this exhibition also aims to draw attention to rehabilitation initiatives of the Manial Palace Museum. In conjunction with the planned events, Art D'Égypte has succeeded in helping the Ministry of Antiquities secure sponsorship from private sector donors for several vital projects at the museum.

About the Manial Palace Museum

The Manial Palace Museum was built by Prince Mohamed Ali (1875 – 1954), son of the Khedive Mohamed Tewfik and brother of the Khedive Abbas Hilmy II. In 1902 the prince purchased 61,711 square metres of land, which was at the time a magnificent garden containing a residence of the French noble, Duke D'Aumont et de Villquier. The prince personally drew up the architectural plans and directed every detail of construction and decoration of the palace and its gardens. By 1937 the work was completed reflecting his personality, his culture and his love of art. The Palace compound has since provided an island of tranquillity from the dust and turmoil of a modernizing Cairo.

About the Egyptian Museum

Designed in the neoclassical style by Marcel Dourgnon and inaugurated in 1902, the Egyptian Museum on Tahrir Square is among the first purpose-built museum in the world. It boasts 107 halls brimming with artefacts dating from the prehistoric through the Roman periods, with most of the collection focused on the pharaonic era. In 1983, the building was classified as a protected monument under the control of the Ministry of Antiquities.
