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Lines is relatively very small and cozy, it's also new. I really love it's setting, in an old house in one of the oldest streets in town and they really played well with the authentic Ammanite feel of the place. The cast iron covering which were probably installed when the house was first built over the huge balconies and the windows are beautifully flaunted. There are citrus trees in the courtyard, and the back balcony overlooks the much-loved view of downtown Amman in the alley and Jbal Il Weibdeh and

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Al-Qal3a across.

The gallery's aura of Levantine style works beautifully well with the works of an artist like Durra.

I am not sure how long the exhibition of Muhanna Durra's work is going to be on display, but I would recommend that you give it a visit as soon as possible if you're in town.
