Birzeit University Museum is organizing on the 19th of March 2016 an art exhibition entitled "Unlike Other Springs", in commemoration of more than twenty years for the establishment of its art collection. The collection was gradually formed through generous contributions by visual artists and University friends from Palestine, the Arab countries and the world at large, who gave their works as gifts to the museum. The number of artworks in the collection today has exceeded 300 works representing modern and contemporary practices, including painting, multimedia, sculpture and video art.

The exhibition "Unlike Other Springs" sheds light on the genesis and evolution of the art collection, show casing the deep historical relationship between the University and the Palestinian and Arab artists as well as artists from various cultural backgrounds. The collection started in 1994 with the first donation to the Museum by Swiss artist René Feurer . By the year 2015 the following artists had also contributed their works to the Museum:

A close relationship between the Museum and artists continues today, recently new art works were added to the collection with the generous contributions from 25 prominent Palestinian artists. These original new works have added a contemporary dimension to the art collection and diverse experiential and thematic representions. The added works convey interesting manifestations on the history of art production in the Palestinian context. The new contributions to the collection are from the following artists:

Moreover, Palestinian researcher and collector George al Amaa Also offered two unique gifts to the collection, a painting on glass by Jabra Ibrahim Jabra, one of the main literary and art giants of Palestine and a landscape drawing by pioneer artist Sophie Halaby.

The exhibition has been conceived and curated by artist Vera Tamari. The works are distributed mainly in the gallery of the Birzeit University Museum museum and in smaller exhibitions on campus and outside.

A program of parallel activities including art workshops, seminars and lectures, meetings with artists and panel discussions is planned in order to deepen students' participation and disseminate knowledge about the various representations of art. The exhibition and its parallel activities echo the Museum's vision that of being an intellectual platform for active debate on contemporary art production and practices.
